

1. Welcome

Welcome to Frontline Magazine Ireland. These are the Terms and Conditions which govern the access and use of the website.

When we refer to the “site” or “website” in these Terms and Conditions, this means Frontline Magazine Ireland online, at <http://www.frontline-ireland.com/> or <http://frontline-ireland.com/> operated by or on behalf of Frontline Magazine (Ireland) with the support of Inclusion Ireland and the Department of Justice and Equality (Roinn Dlí agus Cirt agus Comhlonannais).

These Terms and Conditions apply irrespective of whatever method of “access” is used. This includes all access to the magazine via the web, PDA, mobile phone, Smartphone, RSS feed, digital television or any other means of technology. This applies to all uses of the term “access” in these Terms and Conditions.

Each time you access Frontline Magazine Ireland site, you agree to be bound by these Terms and Conditions.

These Terms and Conditions may be changed from time to time. Any changes are with immediate effect as and from the date of posting unless otherwise specifically stated. The continued access and usage of the site by you after such changes are made shall be deemed to be an acceptance of such changes.

We reserve the right, at our absolute discretion, to suspend your access to or usage of the site in the event that we believe that there may have been a breach by you or others of these Terms and Conditions .

2. Access and Usage of the Content

Your access to and usage of the site are strictly for personal non-commercial purposes.

You acknowledge and irrevocably accept that Frontline Magazine Ireland is the owner or licensee of all content of the site, including copyrights, trademarks, logos, software applications, graphics and other intellectual property rights.

3. Data Protection, Privacy and Fair Usage

Frontline Magazine Ireland respects your right to privacy. Users should be aware that each time they visit a website two general levels of information about their visit can be retained. The first level comprises statistical and other analytical information collected on an aggregate and non-individual-specific basis of all users who visit the site, and the second is information that is personal or particular to a specific visitor, who knowingly chooses to provide that information. Frontline Magazine Ireland's policy is to respect and protect the privacy of all users and will never wilfully disclose individually identifiable information to any third party without first receiving the user's permission.

The statistical and analytical information gives us general (not individual-specific) information about the number of people who visit this website; the number of people who return to this site; the pages that they visit; where they were before they came to this site and the page in the site at which they exited. This information helps us monitor traffic on our website so that we can manage the site's capacity and efficiency. It also helps us to understand which parts of this site are most popular, and generally to assess user behaviour and characteristics in order to measure interest in and use of the various areas of the site.

This statistical, analytical information and data can be collected through the standard operation of our internet servers and logs as well as "cookies". "Cookies" are small text files

that a website can use in order to recognise visitors who revisit a site so as to facilitate their ongoing access to and use of the site. It enables usage behaviour to be tracked and aggregate data to be compiled that would facilitate more targeted advertising and improved content. Typically, cookies involve the assigning of a unique number to the visitor. Users should be aware that Frontline Magazine Ireland is unable to control the use of cookies or the resulting information by other third parties such as advertisers or parties hosting data for Frontline Magazine Ireland. One simple way to prevent the use of cookies is to activate the facility that is available in most web browsers that enables the user to deny or accept cookies.

However, visitors should realise that certain cookies may be necessary in order to provide the visitor with certain features such as the customised delivery of certain information.

Throughout this website you may have an opportunity to send us information relating to you such as through the "contact us" pages or any other area where you may send e-mails, request information, or respond to any requests for articles or information.

By choosing to participate in these, you provide us with personal information relating to you. This information, including text and photographs, will be used by Frontline Magazine Ireland for our publication purposes, but will only be used for the following:

- the purposes for which it was provided by you;
- verification purposes and statistical analysis;
- promotional purposes (social media, email etc.);
- to provide you with details, either electronically or by means of post, by Frontline Magazine Ireland, which we may think would be of interest to you, unless you have specifically requested not to receive this information.

4. Governing Law and Jurisdiction

These Terms and Conditions are governed by Irish law and you agree to submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the Irish courts.

It is specifically agreed that by accessing, using, downloading, viewing, copying, forwarding or in any way making use of the contents of the site, you deem that all such access takes place at the registered offices of Frontline Magazine Ireland, Inclusion Ireland, Unit C2, The Steelworks, Foley Street, Dublin 1, Ireland.
